Roverway is a scouting event dedicated to Rovers and Rangers from 16 to 22 years old, members of the European regions of Scouting and Guiding. Organised previously by Portugal, Italy, Iceland, Finland and France, it's The Netherlands' turn to host Roverway in the summer of 2018.

Baden-Powell once said *“My belief is that we were put into this world of wonders and beauty with a special ability to appreciate them, in some cases to have the fun of taking a hand in developing them, and also in being able to help other people instead of overreaching them and, through it all, to enjoy life - that is, to be happy.”*

Identity statements

The four statements of the identity matrix are the pillars on which Roverway 2018 is built. The identity matrix revolves around personal growth and development and getting to know one's impact on the world. The identity matrix consists of four statements, which together make persons aware of themselves and the impact they have on the world around them. This makes Roverway 2018 different from a 'normal' summer camp. We want Roverway 2018 to offer you a great and super fun camp, but also to be a learning opportunity and maybe even a spiritual experience.

The four statements of the identity matrix are:

"I recognise myself" to encourage you to be self-aware. We want you to be aware of your own strength and weaknesses, and accept them.

"I am open to others" to foster an open and safe atmosphere in which everybody is included without pre-conceptions and is treated equally. We want everybody to celebrate our differences and create an event in which we can learn from each other.

"I can make a difference" to show that we are all responsible for our own destiny. There are no barriers to make a difference. Every event, no matter if it is small or big, starts with the action of one person: you!

"I am involved in the world around me" as our actions have consequences for ourselves as well as for the world around us. We want to stimulate you to develop a strong moral conscience and encourage you to contribute in a manner that is socially, politically and environmentally sustainable. We also hope we can motivate you in supporting others to become involved in the world around you.



Spirituality at Roverway 2018

Welcome

At Roverway 2018 we get together with Rovers and Rangers from across Europe and beyond, some have a religious perspective, others are interested in beliefs and some have no faith. In the Faiths and Beliefs tent we give you the chance to learn about the religions of your fellow Rovers and Rangers, explore your own beliefs and develop your own spirituality.

During Roverway 2018 you can join the European Scout Inter-religious forum, the International Catholic Conference of Guiding, Spiriteco and other faith groups for workshops, drop in sessions and discussions.

On Wednesday 1 August we will have an interfaith ceremony from 9:00 - 9:30 and all are welcome to join.

Code of Conduct

Any successful camp needs a set of 'rules of the game' that allows everyone to have fun while respecting each other. Above all, the first thing we must respect is the law of the Kingdom of The Netherlands. Next to that, Roverway 2018 has its own set of camp rules so everyone can enjoy their time here. Each Path will also establish its own 'rules of the game' that will set out how you will live together with your international friends. The original conditions and camp rules as published on the Roverway 2018 website.

Security

- The Roverway 2018 campsite, both the beach in The Hague and Scout-inglandgoed Zeewolde, will be closed and entrance will be regulated.
- Participants must wear their neckerchief and their identification badge at all time so we can spot intruders easily.
- Participants need to wear their Scout or Guide uniform during all official ceremonies.
- When away from the campsite, participants should be able to identify themselves. Always have your passport or ID card with you.
- Participants should follow the rules about campfires, swimming, knives, sound systems, etc.
- Participants must act according to announcements and directions made by Roverway 2018 Planning Team members.

Unacceptable behaviour

- The possession, consumption or sale of alcohol and drugs during Roverway 2018 is forbidden.
- Smoking is only permitted in designated areas during free time.
- Only businesses authorised by the Roverway 2018 directors will be permitted.
- Respecting the environment
- Fires are only permitted in designated sites and must be put out if not supervised.
- To protect the environment, instructions given at each campsite must be followed.
- Silence is requested in sleeping areas between 23.00 and 07.00.

Respect others

- The Roverway 2018 organisation aims to treat everybody equally and with respect. Therefore violence, disrespect, discrimination and other excessive behavior against others will not be tolerated and can result in elimination from Roverway 2018 at your own cost and without refund.
- Theft and damage to property will be dealt with according to Dutch law.
- Sexual activity is not part of Roverway 2018 as well as sexual activity between participants and non-participants is prohibited. Please respect the privacy of others.
- Please respect everyone's personal space and cultural sensitivities.
- Participants are responsible for personal belongings.

Privacy

Roverway 2018 is held in a time in which privacy gets a lot of attention. Both the Dutch government and the European Parliament accepted new privacy laws. As this is new territory for events like Roverway 2018, much care and attention has been put into this subject. A privacy impact analysis was done resulting in a Privacy policy that can be downloaded from the [Roverway 2018 website](#) (see Chapter 11). Planning Team and Path leaders have been briefed on the specifics of the policy and the impact while organizing the Roverway 2018. More details can be found in the Privacy policy itself.

If rules are not respected, the Roverway 2018 Project Directors can take disciplinary action. Participants are responsible for any costs incurred due to disciplinary action. No refund will be made.

Roverway 2018 in numbers

We are happy to host Roverway 2018 for more than **3500** participants from **52** Contingents and **43** countries from all over the world. Most of you are European, but we also welcome non-Europeans. People travel a great distance to join Roverway 2018. By plane or train, some by car or bike. Travel distances range from 1 km by bike from The Hague; up to **20.000** kilometers from New Zealand. By plane, obviously.

Our organisation consists of about **400-450** Dutch volunteers that have been organising the event for the last two years. Many of them are new to organising large events like Roverway 2018. We are also happy to welcome about 250 IST and additional 100 WOSM and WAGGGS volunteers during the event. And last but not least, you will see a number of VIPs and suppliers on the campsite. The total number of people involved with Roverway 2018 will easily reach **4500**. Which is a great result.

Not only Roverway 2018 itself is interesting to mention when we talk about numbers. Also the 10 planning weekends we hosted before the event itself are impressive enough to mention. On average, **70** different persons participated during each weekend. After **10** weekends, we have served about **3000** meals. In addition, there was some international travelling too, because the Steering Committee is international and the WOSM and WAGGGS teams participated in many weekends. In total, over 100 international trips by flights, train and car were made to The Netherlands and other countries in Europe. Organising Roverway 2018 during these weekends has proven to be very effective.

Another view on “Roverway 2018 in numbers” is the average age of the Steering Committee, which is **24** years old. This team is supported with an experienced group of supporters with a “slightly” older average age.

Roverway 2018, an international event in The Netherlands

Roverway 2018 is an international event organised by Scouting Nederland together the World Organisation of the Scout Movement (WOSM) and the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS).

Scouting Nederland

Scouting Nederland is the national organisation for Scouts and Guides in The Netherlands. Her Royal Highness Queen Máxima is patroness of the organisation. Over 100,000 active members in over thousand local groups are dedicated to develop themselves. About 20% of the groups is active as “Seascout”, sailing the vast number of Dutch lakes and rivers. Scouting Nederland is member of both WOSM and WAGGGS, which means it's open for both girls and boys aged between 5 and 21 years. The Netherlands have hosted several large scale international events. Like the fifth World Jamboree in 1937 (with BP present!); the European Jamboree in 1994 and the 18th World Jamboree in 1995.

World Organization of the Scout Movement

The World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM) is the largest international Scouting organisation and is made up of 169 National Scout Organisations. The World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts is the largest voluntary Movement, dedicated to girls and young women, in the world. Sustainability

We will drastically reduce the amount of disposables during the event. Scoutinglandgoed Zeevolde will be car-free to keep our gas emissions to a minimum. Furthermore, the Path leaders have received tips and guidelines for a sustainable Roverway 2018. As a result, we believe and trust in a responsible event from the very beginning to the very end!

A large part of the programme will be related to sustainability, so you will discover how sustainability is a part of everything we do on daily basis. For example, you will be able to earn the World Scout Environmental Badge by participating in activities related to Sustainability!

We aim to offer challenging, fun and inspiring activities for everyone, to embrace the topic and to go back home with a new motivation and new ideas to act for a better world. Because at the end of the day, the change for a better environment starts with you!



Communication during Roverway 2018

Welcome

During Roverway 2018 there are different ways of finding out what is going on! As modern Scouts and Guides, we will try to share as much as possible with you via Social Media. Road safety and travel tips

Staying healthy and alive in real life is not so difficult. You managed up to now, so you'll make it during Roverway 2018. Just look around you when you want to get across.

Transport in The Netherlands

More than a quarter of The Netherlands is below sea level, but that is not relevant for this topic. The Netherlands is a small and crowded country. Therefore, distances are short and the variety of travel options is huge. There are, of course, trains and buses for longer distances. In big cities you can even take a train within city limits. There are metros and trams in larger cities, there are taxis and also uber; we all ride bikes and even skateboards.

Vehicles like cars and buses drive on the right side of the road. Bicycles usually use the right side of the road as well, but they sometimes fail to do so. Trains and trams follow steel tracks. As a pedestrian, it's best to give right of way to bigger means of transport. Use the pedestrians crossing if possible. And always stop for red lights!

Travel to The Hague

Roverway 2018 will kick off at the best location possible, the beach of Scheveningen! And Scheveningen means: sun, sand and sea. So pack your swimsuit and beach towel! Before you reach this heavenly place, travel to Houtrustweg 600 in The Hague.

“Travel, register, put up your tent along with your Path-buddies. Then change into your swimsuit and dive into the North Sea! Roverway away we say!”

Good to know

- Swimming in The Hague is allowed during daytime. You can only swim in the area which has the specific signing indicating it as swimming area. Swimming during nighttime is forbidden.
- There will be no WiFi connection, but you will get the best connection with your fellow Rovers and Rangers.

Registration and Blue bags

Registration

Starting from 1 July, you'll receive a personal Email from Roverway 2018. This Email contains a personal and unique QR code. Make sure to bring it with you on your mobile phone, tablet or printed on paper. A print out is probably the best option!

When you arrive on the beach of The Hague, go to the Registration tent and present the QR code. Although you probably travel as a troop or whole Contingent, registration will be done on an individual basis.

Blue bags

The Blue Bag is an optional piece of luggage (max. 15kg and max. 60*50*40 cm) you can drop off after registration in The Hague. This luggage will be brought to Scoutinglandgoed Zeewolde. You'll pick it up when you arrive there on 29 July - after your Path experience.

If you have a piece of luggage that needs to be dropped off as a Blue Bag, please follow the instructions you receive during registration. If you want to know more about the Blue Bags, download the [Travel Guide](#) from our website and check Chapter 5.2.

In case of lost luggage at the airport, your luggage should be sent to Scoutinglandgoed Zeewolde, Nulderpad 5, 3896 LV. From there on, we will deliver it at the right Path location.

The beach

Spread out over the beach, you can find several activities, which will vary in intensity. You will have time to enjoy volleyball fields, frisbee activities and a sand castle competition. The activities are open from 10:00-17:00.

At the same time, there will be central organised activities in which all participants present on the beach at that moment can participate. These activities will be led from the stage and they will all have fixed times.

There is limited space available on the beach, so we encourage you to leave the beach and participate in the activities and programme in Scheveningen.

Crazy88

Crazy88 means carrying out as many tasks as possible and beating other teams with your originality. You can either do them independently or with a group. There will be the opportunity to play several games too.

All participants will get a map of the 'playing area' and a card with the Crazy88 challenges.

The guided activities in the 'playing area' are marked on the map and there will be staff present to get the best out of the activity. The tasks and challenges for Crazy88 in Westduinpark and Scheveningen enable you to explore the area and see some of the highlights. Crazy88 will take place from 10:00 to 15:00. Everyone has to be back on the beach at 17.00.

Evening programme

After an afternoon of fun and activities the Roverway 2018 journey will officially begin with our Opening Ceremony. Everyone will get together while enjoying music, dancing and special guests and to start our Roverway 2018 adventure together! Don't forget to bring your singing voices and dancing feet!

After the Opening Ceremony it is not time to go to bed yet. There's the sea, there's music at the stage. Near the sea we will have two large campfires where you can get together. Here you can relax, meet other Rovers and Rangers and maybe make some music.

You can also choose to go on a nocturnal hike in the dunes, guided by lightsticks. The hike in the dunes is about 2 km long.

Food in The Hague

Dinner in The Hague will start at 17:00. Make sure you are back at the beach at 19:00 latest to get some food. You don't have to cook yourself, dinner will be arranged for you.

A Dutch day at the beach needs Dutch beach food to top it off. We want you to enjoy our Dutch chips and deep fried meats, fish or veggies. Brought to you by professional chefs, it won't get more comfortable than this. We will enjoy this experience while we will sit down together to see the sun sinking into the sea.

Breakfast on Tuesday 24 July is served at the beach. Lunch is a buffet before you'll get in the bus to your Path. You'll have one chance to get your lunch before getting on the bus.

Paths

What is a Path?

The real experience of Roverway 2018 comes from taking part in a Path. Together with Rovers and Rangers from across Europe, you will experience five unforgettable days scattered with campfire, laughter, fun, learning and friendships that will last forever.

The Paths are organised around specific activities. The Path's activities can be embedded in a specific region or linked to a local scouting group. You will take part in local life, work and get to know the locals and the other Rovers and Rangers and their cultures.

The Path leaders have had the freedom to put their own interpretation into the Path they built and to show you all the different sides The Netherlands can offer you. For sure you can find a number of themes in a certain way such as: culture, nature, active and social.

During your Path you will learn that it will not only be about the activities, but also about awareness. Awareness of yourself and who you are, but also what your environment looks like. What influence you can exercise to determine your own future. You get the opportunity to

learn to be open to others, how you can make a difference, how you can get involved in the world around you and how to recognize yourself.

Who does what on the Path?

Every Path is staffed by 3 to 4 Path leaders. They have worked over the past year on the programme that you are going to take part in. Some input from you is also expected. After all, Roverway isn't only for Rovers and Rangers, but also made by Rovers and Rangers.

You are going to take care of your own experience during your Path. You will learn a lot from Dutch culture and find out how it is different from your own culture. We ask you to show your own culture and to share it with your fellow participants during your Path.

Creating bonds with the Scouts from your Path

Roverway 2018 will give you a unique opportunity to live closely with other Rovers and Rangers from across the world and get to learn about their cultures. Living together means sharing experiences and making new friends. Take the time to talk to everyone on your Path, find out their stories and share yours. Along the way you are guaranteed to find similarities and differences but all these don't matter and you will soon become the best of friends. Remember that all your differences show that OPPOSITES ATTRACT.

Celebrate and share your country's way of Scouting and Guiding, make sure you bring to Roverway 2018 games, songs or food that represents your country. Share these during your Path and at Zeewolde and find the similarities and differences between each other's cultures.

Get to know the Dutch way

Every Path discloses a different side of Dutch culture. From history, culture and traditions to music and literature. It's important to challenge yourself and open up; to learn and to experience.

People from The Netherlands are called 'Dutch' and that's also the official language. The country is often called Holland, but Holland is only a province. Or, to make it more confusing, there is one province named South Holland and one named North Holland. The Hague is in "South". Amsterdam is in "North". Zeewolde is in neither of these, it is in Flevoland.

The Dutch are usually very friendly, open to diversity and are known for being direct. Salute your bus driver, find out how tall the Dutch are and be amazed by the different backgrounds the Dutch can have. The Dutch are usually good with languages. Everyone knows a little English, German, French, Spanish or Arab, but they are often less good at it than they think.

The orange colour derives from prince William of Orange-Nassau, who liberated the country from the Spanish royals.

Building up your Path

Roverway 2018 is a place of both cultural and social diversity. This is the reason why you will see a big variety of Paths and perhaps you can even find some with no similarities. Though every Path will show different sides of The Netherlands and its hidden figures.

The activities will represent opportunities to meet people, get involved and provide services. Through your involvement with Rovers and Rangers from different countries, you will send a strong message to everyone; a mutual support, sharing and development that knows no boundaries.

Community engagement:

Roverway 2018 is not only an event with great activities; it's also an event in which the true Scouting and Guiding spirit returns. This part of Roverway is called community engagement. This means helping someone else or learning and participating in partnership with someone else or an organisation.


Terra Nova is one of the Paths that includes a community engagement project. In the most rural part of the Netherlands, Achterhoek, where the Path is set, you are going

to help out at a care farm, run by people with autism.

Co-construction

Co-construction is an important part of Paths. It gives you the space to contribute to the Path's programme you joined with your patrol.

Most of the Paths will have at least one international night or a part of the day during which you can share your own culture and traditions with your Path buddies. You can show what your country and culture is like by bringing food, show us what scouting is like, play some music or show us your dance moves. It is all up to your own creativity!

Foodhouses

The Finnish Sauna is the perfect way to wash off Path dust and relax in a hot and steamy sauna. You can also take a dip in the lake too, if you feel like doing just that.

The German foodhouse welcomes you with 'Original German Gemütlichkeit' in our large black tent construction. It's a place to meet old and new friends and enjoy some German food and beverages. Scoutinglandgoed Zeewolde

Introduction and general site rules

We proudly welcome you to the new [International Dutch Scout Centre Scoutinglandgoed Zeewolde](#). After your Paths, you will all gather here, where the main camp of Roverway 2018 will take place. This 70 hectares estate is located in the province of Flevoland, on land that was reclaimed from the sea half a century ago. This basically means the whole camp will take place below sea level!

The site in Zeewolde was officially opened in 2015 by Queen Máxima, our patroness. The International Scout and Guide Centre offers endless opportunities to hike and undertake activities in the surrounding forest and nature. Across the dyke, the site has direct access to open water for sailing and other water activities.

The centre was developed by Scouting Nederland on a former forestry site. 'New' nature has been developed, ponds were created and in the last few years additional facilities and accommodations were built. Sustainability and accessibility for the disabled have been a few aims during the site development. Zeewolde isn't far from the site of the 18th World Jamboree of 1995.

Subcamps

We have set up subcamps around the estate. When you arrive, you and the rest of your Path will be allocated to one of these subcamps.

A subcamp is made up of several Paths living together side by side. There will be seven subcamps for the participants, all with really nice tulip names. IST, CMT and HoCs have their own subcamp.

At each participant subcamp, there will be a central area with tents where you can get your daily information. In these subcamp tents you can chill, play a game or charge your phone. This is also the place where you have to come and pick up the ingredients for your dinner. Each subcamp has a team to make sure everything runs well and to help you have the best experience of your stay at the subcamp.

Site rules

- Participants have to follow the safety instructions they get when setting up tents.
- It is not allowed to sleep in a hammock in the forest.
- In the subcamps, it is not allowed to make a campfire on another place than the designated place for cooking. There will be campfires at the central market during the night.
- Crossing the dyke after sunset or before sunrise is not allowed, it is unsafe to swim there.
- Swimming is only allowed in the waters signed with a sign like this:



Meals

In your subcamp you will find everything you need for preparing the meals (crockery, fire pits, etc.). The ingredients for each meal will be distributed to each subcamp from the storage area.

- Breakfast and lunch boxes will be served at the Food Distribution tents near your subcamp. Make sure you are there on time to collect the boxes with your Path buddies.
- In order to make the most out of each day, a hot dinner will be served on the first and last day at Zeewolde.
- On 29 July you'll arrive at Zeewolde. Dinner will be cooked and served at 17:00 at Buitendijks near the dyke. The same system will be applied for the last day of your stay at Zeewolde.
- During the second and the third day you'll have to cook your dinner yourself on a campfire at the designated places. Volunteers will be there to help you with the campfire and food handout will start at 16:45. You'll have time to cook until 20:00.
- Please keep to the existing fire areas. Make sure you have a water source nearby and do not leave any fires unattended.
- If you have special dietary needs, please check with your subcamp staff whether the information you provided during registration has been taken into account.

Facilities

You can drink tap water in The Netherlands. If this is not possible then it will be indicated by the following sign. Water from ditches and lakes is not indicated to be used.

Water is not for consumption

There are also water points in each subcamp where you can find drinking water, or water to clean your dishes and doing laundry.

During Roverway 2018 you will find a washroom area in your subcamp. In this area which will be shared with the other participants, there are toilets, showers and washbasins.

All of these areas will have facilities for people with reduced mobility. We advise you to take good care of yourself; take a shower, but not too long. The campsite is running a sustainable development initiative and it's also better for the environment. Please leave the cabin clean after use.

Waste management

We separate all waste during Roverway 2018. You mustn't throw waste away on the ground, in the forest, or bury it.

For everyone's comfort, please make sure you carefully follow the instructions for sorting and managing waste. These instructions are on display in your subcamp. The second separation is done in special installations by our supplier. There is still a further separation taking place which our waste gets a sequel.

Payment system

Roverway 2018 is a cashless camp.

A personal RFID card will be used to store your electronic tokens. This card will be handed out during registration in The Hague. This card can be used to pay your consumptions at foodhouses for instance. During every transaction with your RFID card you can see the remaining total tokens on your card.

Tokens can be loaded on your personal card at self service machines, where you can use your bank card to pay for these tokens. Or you can go to the 'bank' where someone will help you to load tokens onto your card. At this bank it is preferable to pay with your bank card, or with cash, but then only Euro are accepted. A list of accepted cards will be published on the Roverway website

You can use your RFID card on the beach in The Hague and at Scout-
inglandgoed Zeewolde.

There will be no ATM at the camp-site.

Shops and ScoutShop

ScoutShop

Do you want to have a Roverway 2018 scarf? Or do you feel like bringing small goodies home? Or did you forget something practical?

ScoutShop will have a solution for you. At The Hague and at Zeewolde, ScoutShop will be opened for you and can provide you with various products. In case you want to take a peak you can have a look in the Dutch ScoutShop on www.scoutshop.nl If you need equipment like tents or chairs ScoutShop can provide those for you too, but please get in contact with them prior to Roverway 2018 via shop@scouting.nl.

Take care

Health isn't just treating injuries, it's also learning to look after yourself and to respect and love yourself.

Camping with thousands of Rangers, Rovers and volunteers might bring you a lot of new experiences. There is a constant flow of activities, meetings and impressions. Perhaps you would like a moment for yourself to reflect on all of that, be in a relaxed atmosphere, have a conversation about what you have experienced: Did you find love? Do you feel lonely? Have you got worries? Or do you just want someone to listen?

You can find the Take Care tent at Zeewolde where you are welcome, where you can just be you! In this area, nothing is taboo and nobody is judging you. Our listeners are ready to hear about your worries or just for a good chat. Anything you say in confidence will be treated with respect and discretion by adults there.

In case you have health problems, please go to the First Aid point. For those who need it, the main infirmary is open for consultation 24 hours a day.

First aid

In The Hague and in Zeewolde you'll be able to visit the First aid. We have medical staff and doctors present 24 hours per day. In case you need to visit the hospital, the First aid team will set up an appointment for you.

Programme at Zeewolde, blokken- schema and day structure

After an amazing time during your Path, everyone will get together for the last amazing days of Roverway 2018 at Scoutinglandgoed Zeewolde.

As everyone will arrive at different times during this arrival, you are provided with walk-in activities. For example, you can already go sailing on the water, visit one of the foodhouses and visit the 'Chill but Challenged' area.

In the evening we will have an Opening Ceremony on the central stage to celebrate being together again.

Chill but challenged (29 July until 2 August)

'Chill but Challenged' will take place in the Central Market area. The main goal of this area is to chill, to enjoy relaxing moments with your friends from over the world. But to chill doesn't mean doing nothing at all.

"Opposites Attract" created the possibility to be relax on a sofa with a cocktail or to have access to a jam session, to play boards games, feel like child in a ball pit and during the evening to sing with

friends or dance in the Silent Disco. This friendly area is opened from 9:00 to 2:00 in the morning.

Chill and Challenge your life!

Activity Fields (30 & 31 July)

There are four activity fields at Zeewolde for the duration of two days. The development of every activity is one of our identity statements.

**I am involved in the world

(field: World & Harbour)

You will have the chance to participate on all fields. How will that work? An Activity Field is open during the morning and afternoon. For example, a participant will visit the first two fields on 30 July, and the other two fields on 31 July. Participants will be allocated to

the right fields where these activities take place. The activity fields will run from 9:30 - 12:00 & 14:30 - 17:00.

Here are some examples of the activities you can find on each field:

Open & Water

Everything is related to being open to others: finding your opposite, building a raft together, learning Dutch, sailing and canoeing on the water.

Recognise & Fun

Recognising yourself is about who you are: The School of Life, an escape room and interesting lectures from speakers like a CEO, chairman or professional athlete.

Difference & Change

Making a difference where the activities are about: sustainability, recycling, but also everything ranging from building dykes, or preventing bullying on social media.

World & Harbour

This activity will be located in Zeewolde, the town closest to our event. Activities that will be done on this field are: cycling, making new land, friendship bracelets and traditional Dutch games.

Be green and join the Environmental and Sustainable Programme (30 et 31 July)

Roverway 2018 and Scoutingland-goed Zeewolde offer you a unique programme about Environment and Sustainability.

With the base in the 'Chill but Challenged' area there is a wide variety of activities all over the campsite which will help you to become more eco friendly and more aware of your own behaviour.

Think about calculating your eco footprint while playing a game about the UN Sustainable development goals, testing the water and air quality and make art out of waste.

When you do a number of 'green activities' and a small service project you will be rewarded with a WOSM badge and a Dutch badge about the environment. You can get the Green Strip card at the 'Chill but Challenged' zone where you can be provided with more information too.

Life Action Game (1 August)

On 1 August all participants will engage in a spectacular Life Action Game. This role playing game will help participants, while working in teams, to learn their own strengths and working together to build their own community in real life.

Communities need to establish rules and systems to make every member of the society feel involved and support the weakest and the strongest. Communities can score credits by doing tasks, by challenging other communities and by investing time and helping others. We will celebrate like a community does and care like a community does.

But life doesn't always run smoothly, we must be prepared to work together, to make a difference and spread the love.

If you lose anything during your Path, please contact your Path leader on how to resolve or better, mobilize your Path for a search party.


To see what your tasks are for the day, you can use 'Scout-tool'. In combination with your unique QR-code, you can read what you'll be doing that day on that website.

Every day from 25 July till 1 August there will be a meeting for IST at the IST Hangout from 17:00 till 17:30. We'll bring you the latest news and updates on who is needed at some specific tasks. If you're not able to make it to this meeting due to the tasks you're planned to do, the information that needs to be shared can be found at the messageboard in the Job Centre and in your subcamp. It will also be published on the special Facebook group for IST, so you can find it anytime you need it.

Working environment

Every task, job or role in Roverway 2018 is different from you are used to. Working in an international workforce, that only exists for 11 days, is spectacular. To see what comes out of all our talents together is amazing! Here are some things to consider to make it a success.

- Be flexible. Things might change and extra help might be needed, even at short notice. Try to do your best and help out whenever you're needed.
- You might work for eight hours a day. Prepare yourself for that and make the most out of the time that's left. Besides sleeping and resting ...
- If you're having a hard time, please share it, so we can help you. Consider going to the 'Take care tent' or to someone who you are comfortable to talk to.
- To have the best time, being on time helps to all have a great start of every day and every task.

Working in an international environment

In our guidelines from “[Safe within Roverway 2018](#)”, the online training that all the IST have to follow, you have had the chance to find information on how to work in an international workforce.

Social or cultural differences

With so many people from so many countries, there are bound to be differences in values, beliefs, opinions and actions. How we behave is affected by where we are from and what we are used to. To meet each other in curiosity helps to bridge cultural differences. Talk and ask, delay your judgement. You might get to know the world a little better by doing so.

Stereotypes

You can probably think of at least one stereotype for people from a particular country. If you are willing to see the uniqueness in every person from that country, a more in-depth point of view might enter your heart. How many stereotypes can you dismantle in your head during Roverway 2018?

Racism, bullying and insensitivity

Any negative remarks or behaviour based on race, nationality, religion, gender etc. will not be tolerated.

Enjoy and respect the diversity of language, culture, traditions and nationalities. If you feel a victim of this, please contact your supervisor, Team leader or someone working in the IST job office!

Communication and language

Not everybody speaks your language. Because so many speak another language a lot of activity takes place in all of our brains at the same time, constantly translating and trying to comprehend what is said, replying and then getting to action. Please adjust your speaking rate to those listening to you. Try to use easy language and phrases. And if words don't work, be creative!

In the “[Safe within Roverway 2018](#)”, a lot of cultural differences are described. It's good to know that people from The Netherlands can be 'short and direct' in their communication. We love to work hard and sometimes we don't say much more than needed. Being on time or even early is also a part of Dutch culture. It would be appreciated if you could adopt this cultural behaviour during Roverway 2018, it helps us all to get the best and most out of Roverway 2018.

Take care of yourself

The experience of Roverway brings energy, but also takes energy. Please take care of yourself during the event in all possible ways.

Hygiene

As you will be working, dirt and sweating happen. Please, take care of your personal hygiene. There will be facilities to wash your hands properly near all toilets. At the IST subcamp, there will be showers.

Resting and Sleep

Working as a member of IST is an intense experience. A lot of work needs to be done and working with many new people is demanded. Try to understand each other and expect to find different 'language skills' than you already have. When there is no work, there is so much going on you can join. Keep in your mind that you are in a camp that lasts 11 days. Being tired doesn't help you to get the most out of Roverway 2018. Take into account how much sleep you need to function at a happy level, not only for yourself, but also for the ones you work with.

Besides sleep you also might need time just for yourself, like reading a book, go for a swim, meditate or take a nap.

Take your time when you're not on the job!

If you want to be somewhere with people around you, grab a drink at the IST Bar and enjoy the IST Lounge or the 'Chill but Challenged' area which will be opened from 29 July till 2 August.

Working shifts and irregular working hours

Some of the IST members might work during the evening or night. Shifts will be made in such a way that you can enjoy the Roverway 2018 vibe, not only at these nightly hours. Please respect each other's need for sleep at all times and avoid making noise in the IST subcamp, especially for those working late or during the night. Show consideration to those who need to rest.

Eating & Drinking

Proper meals will be provided for all IST, Planning Team and Contingent Management Team members at the restaurant. These meals will be balanced and give you the energy you need. Especially when it's hot, stay hydrated and keep drinking liquids.

Drinking water is available from all taps and can be found all over the campsite. If you're looking for something else to drink, the IST Bar and foodhouses will be happy to serve you a drink and a snack. Coffee and tea will be provided from early in the morning until 21:00 at the restaurant.

Your health

If you require specific help, please contact First Aid.

During this time of the year, there might be some mosquitoes and other insects, like ticks. Use insect repellent at the start of the evening starts if you don't want to be stung. If you find a tick on your body, please have it removed at First Aid as soon as possible.



Core teams

As IST members you'll be working in teams. Some of you will work in permanent team with Planning Team members. Some of you will be in small patrols and working in different teams every day. Besides it's easier to get the job done, your team is also the group in which we hope you'll find your 'home' during these days. Take care of each other, so if someone from your team is not happy, ask if there is anything you can do. If you start work and you miss someone from your team, please check this out.

IST members might be working with the teams mentioned below. It might happen that you work in one team the entire time or are active in a couple of teams. Here is a brief description of what every team does:

Program Opposites

During the time at Zeewolde this team will take care of the complete package of entertainment during Roverway 2018. Not only during the day, but also at the 'Chill but Challenged' area and also after midnight. IST help to get everybody involved and give everybody a great time.

Program Attract

Never joined a Life Action Game? Here's your chance! On 1 August this team will provide the action. IST assist the teams that are joining. Besides this, a Faith & Religion team will provide space for religious meetings. The food-houses are also part of this team and Childcare will also be provided during the event. A team with a high variety of tasks.

Paths

The team that transforms the first part of Roverway 2018 into an amazing adventure. They provide Paths for all participants and some IST might join to make them even a bigger success.

Food

Having great fun doesn't come without great food. At Zeewolde food will be provided to all participants, who will make the regular meals themselves. Those who support will have dinner in our restaurant, where three meals a day will be provided. Of course this all needs to be distributed and cooked, so IST will participate in this will distribute energy to all.

Services

A shower, running water, lights, power and tents, all things that we expect there to be, but all these things have to be set up, built up and connected. This team manages to get these facilities ready for all participants. IST who serve this team will work with a hands-on mentality to get it all ready in time. From Logistics to Pioneering, from Stage building to plumping, from First Aid to Safety.

Marketing & Communications

This team will let you and others hear what great things are happening during Roverway 2018! They spread the stories that you're building, not only for the Rovers and Rangers participating, but all over Europe and beyond.

Finance

If you want a drink or to buy a souvenir, money is involved. This team will provide you with the card you use to buy the things you need during the event. In the background they might be working on the budget, in our 'banks' you can upload your Roverway account for your drinks, snacks and of course the beautiful souvenirs.

International Relations

This team is the connection between Roverway 2018 and the attending Contingents. They are also responsible for hosting for the VIPs during the event and providing them with a true Roverway 2018 experience.

Information Management

Planning such an event is all about bringing lots of information together. This team provides the data to make it all work. If you're registered, they were the ones involved.

Human Resources

Get everybody at the right spot to challenge their talents? That's the goal of this team! Tasks and talents are connected at the IST Job Centre.
